Scope and Content Note

The papers of Henry Clay Taylor (1845-1904) span the years 1862-1904, with the bulk of the material concentrated in the period 1897-1900. The collection consists of correspondence; Taylor's writings, including an unpublished novel, "Naroonya"; printed matter pertaining to the Spanish-American War; and photographs. The major portion of the correspondence consists of copies of letters written when Taylor commanded the USS *Indiana* (battleship).

Prominent correspondents include George Dewey, Samuel C. Lemley, Stephen Bleeker Luce, C. R. P. Rodgers, and William Thomas Sampson.
