A recorded vote by electronic device was ordered in the Committee of the Whole on the following amendment submitted by Mr. ROHRABACHER:

Page 25, after line 18, insert the following: "SEC. 1003. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS.

"None of the funds authorized in section 1002 shall be made available to a local educational agency unless-

(1) such agency, beginning on October 1, 1994, and continuing on or before such date in each subsequent year, submits to the Assistant Secretary of Education for Elementary and Secondary Education, a statement regarding the total number of students enrolled in its school system, the number of students enrolled who are not lawfully in the United States, the number of students who are lawfully in the United States who do not have at least 1 parent or legal guardian who is lawfully in the United States, and the average per pupil expenditure of the local educational agency.

(2) The data submitted under paragraph (1) shall be current as of any date in the 30-day period prior to the date that the Assistant Secretary requires.

17.17 MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT— UKRAINE GSP

The SPEAKER pro tempore, Mr. RANGEL, laid before the House a message from the President, which was read as follows:

To the Congress of the United States:

I am writing to inform you of my intent to add Ukraine to the list of beneficiary developing countries under the Generalized System of Preferences (GSP). The GSP program offers dutyfree access to the U.S. market and is authorized by the Trade Act of 1974.

I have carefully considered the criteria identified in sections 501 and 502 of the Trade Act of 1974. In light of these criteria, and particularly Ukraine's level of development and iniparticularly tiation of economic reforms, I have determined that it is appropriate to extend GSP benefits to Ukraine.

This notice is submitted in accordance with section 502(a)(1) of the Trade Act of 1974.
