Fiscal year 1996- $\$ 4.9$ billion in budget authority and $\$ 1.5$ billion in outlays;
Fiscal year 1997- $\$ 5.8$ billion in budget authority and $\$ 4$ billion in outlays;
Fiscal year 1998-\$9.9 billion in budget authority and $\$ 7$ billion in outlays; and
Fiscal year 1999- $\$ 21.8$ billion in budget authority and $\$ 9.9$ billion in outlays.
Provided further, That conferees be instructed to agree to that portion of section 50 of the Senate amendment which provides that "If the President's defense budget request is approved, since 1985 real defense spending will have been reduced by 45 percent by 1999; and President Clinton, during his State of the Union Address on J anuary 25, 1994, promised no further cuts in defense spending" and therefore insist that no further cuts be made in defense by agreeing to the highest possible level of funding for defense (within the scope of the conference).
