(b) PROCEDURES FOR DETERMINATION.-In determining compliance with subsection (a), the Director shall-(1) include on any grant or contract application questions as to whether the educational institution has, by policy or practice, effectively denied such entry or access for recruiting purposes; and (2) inquire of the Department of Defense whether such entry or access has been denied by an institution before awarding such grant or contract to it. (c) DEFINITIONS.—For purposes of this section—(1) the term "student" means an individual enrolled in an educational institution who is 17 years of age or older; and (2) the term "directory information" means, with respect to a student, the student's name, address, telephone listing, date and place of birth, level of education, degrees received, and the most recent educational institution enrolled in by the student.
