53.12 MESSAGE FROM THE SENATE

A message from the Senate by Mr.
Hallen, one of its clerks, announced
that the Senate had passed without
amendment a concurrent resolution of
the House of the following title:

H. Con. Res. 236. Concurrent resolution au-
thorizing the 1994 Special Olympics Torch
Relay to be run through the Capitol
Grounds.

The message also announced that the
Senate disagreed to the amendments of
the House to the amendment of the
Senate to the bill (H.R. 3355), an act to
amend the Omnibus Crime Control and
Safe Streets Act of 1968 to allow grants
to increase police presence, to expand
and improve cooperative efforts be-
tween law enforcement agencies and
members of the community to address
crime and disorder problems, and oth-
erwise to enhance public safety, agreed
to the conference asked by the House
on the disagreeing votes of the two
Houses thereon, and appointed Mr.
BIDEN, Mr. KENNEDY, Mr. METZENBAUM,
Mr. DECONCINI, Mr. LEAHY, Mr. HATCH,
Mr. THURMOND, Mr. SIMPSON, and Mr.
GRASSLEY to be the conferees on the
part of the Senate.
