A recorded vote by electronic device was ordered in the Committee of the Whole on the following amendment submitted by Mr. SPENCE:

At the end of title X (page 277, after line 2), insert the following new section:

SEC. . CREDIT AGAINST ASSESSMENTS FOR UNITED STATES EXPENDITURES IN SUPPORT OF UNITED NATIONS PEACEKEEPING OPERATIONS.

(a) ANNUAL REPORT.—The President shall, at the time of submission of the budget to Congress for any fiscal year, submit to the appropriate committees of Congress a report on the total amount of funds appropriated for national defense purposes for any fiscal year after fiscal year 1994 that were expended during the preceding fiscal year to support or participate in, directly or indirectly, United Nations peacekeeping activities. Such report shall include a breakdown by United Nations peacekeeping operation of the amount of funds expended to support or participate in each such operation.

LIMITATION.—Notwithstanding other provision of law, in each fiscal year beginning with fiscal year 1996, funds may be obligated or expended for payment to the United Nations of the United States assessed share of peacekeeping operations for that fiscal year only to the extent that such assessed share exceeds the total amount identified in the report submitted pursuant to subsection (a) for the preceding fiscal year, reduced by the amount of any reimbursement or credit to the United States by the United Nations for the costs of United States support for, or participation in, United Nations peacekeeping activities for that fiscal year.

(c) DEFINITIONS.—As used in this section:

(1) The term "United Nations peacekeeping activities" means any international peacekeeping, peacemaking, peace-enforcing, or similar activity that is authorized by the United Nations Security Council under chapter VI or VII of the United Nations Charter. (2) The term "appropriate committees of Congress'' means-

(A) the Committee on Armed Services, the Committee on Appropriations, and the Committee on Foreign Affairs of the House of Representatives; and

(B) the Committee on Armed Services, the Committee on Appropriations, and the Committee on Foreign Relations of the Senate.
