contract with, any entity using funds made available in this Act, the head of each Federal agency shall provide, to the greatest extent practicable, to such entity a notice describing the statement made in subsection (a) by the Congress.

This Act may be cited as the "Foreign Operations, Export Financing, and Related Programs Appropriations Act, 1995".
