At the conclusion of consideration of the bill for amendment the Committee shall rise and report the bill to the House with such amendments as may have been adopted. The previous question shall be considered as ordered on the bill and amendments thereto to final passage without intervening motion except one motion to recommit.

SEC. 2. At any time after the adoption of this resolution the Committee on Appropriations may file a supplemental report on H.R. 4539 as part 2 of House Report 103-534.

Whereas, the Report of the Committee on House Administration selectively included portions of the transcript of the proceedings of the Task Force in the Appendix of their Report:

Whereas, efforts in the 102d Congress to release the full transcript of the Task Force were defeated in the House on July 22, 1992 and July 23, 1992 and again on July 22, 1993;

Whereas, the former Postmaster of the House of Representatives, Robert V. Rota, from 1978 continuing until April 1992 has admitted to conspiring with other persons to commit offenses against the United States;

Whereas, the former Postmaster has pled guilty to making false statements to the Task Force and during interviews with United States Postal Inspectors and the Congressional Committee investigating the House Post Office:

Whereas, the former Postmaster admitted to engaging in a cover up of the exchange of vouchers and postage stamps for cash beginning in May 1980 and continuing throughout the House investigation of the post office;
