Whereas, the integrity of the House of Representatives has been impugned by the actions of Mr. Rota and others;

Whereas, on J uly 23, 1993, the House approved a privileged resolution offered by the Majority Leader that stated: "That it is the sense of the House that should the United States Attorney for the District of Columbia at any time inform the House that he has no objection to the public release of the transcripts of proceedings of the former Task Force, then the House shall consider immediately the question of whether and under what circumstances the transcripts of proceedings of the former Task Force should be released to the public;'

Whereas, the United States Attorney for the District of Columbia has indicated in a letter to the Speaker and the Minority Leader that "in light of recent action by the Grand Jury in the criminal investigation, this Office no longer objects to the public release of the materials in question." Now, therefore, be it

Resolved, That the House make public in printed form all transcripts and other relevant documents from any House Administration Committee investigation of the House Post Office as soon as possible.

Resolved, further that the Majority and Minority Leader shall each designate a Member to review the materials and that these materials shall be made public unless the designees agree to the contrary.

When said resolution was considered.
After debate,
On motion of Mr. MICHEL, the previous question was ordered on the resoIution to its adoption or rejection.

The question being put viva voce,
Will the House agree to said resolution?
