Resolved, That the House make public in printed form all transcripts and other relevant documents from any House Administration Committee investigation of House Post Office as soon as possible.

Resolved, further that the Majority and Minority Leader shall each designate a Member to review the materials and that these materials shall be made public unless the designees agree to the contrary.
