Management activities to maintain or restore fish and wildlife populations and the habitats to support such populations may be carried out within wilderness areas designated by this title and shall include the use of motorized vehicles by the appropriate State agencies.

Page 34, after line 18, insert the following: SEC. 112. FISH AND WILDLIFE MANAGEMENT.

As provided in section 4(d)(7) of the Wilderness Act, nothing in this title shall be construed as affecting the jurisdiction of the

State of California with respect to fish and wildlife on the public lands located in that State. Management activities to maintain or restore fish and wildlife populations and the habitats to support such populations may be carried out within wilderness areas designated by this title and shall include the use of motorized vehicles by the appropriate State agencies, particularly where such agencies deem vehicular access is necessary to maintain water sources constructed to preserve desert bighorn sheep and other wildlife.

Page 34 after line 25, insert the following: WILDLIFE MANAGEMENT

SEC. —. In furtherance of the purposes of the Wilderness Act, management activities to maintain or restore fish and wildlife populations may be carried out within wilderness areas designed by this title, where consistent with relevant wilderness management plans and in accordance with appropriate policies and guidelines (including policies and guidelines related to use of motorized equipment)
