Dear Mr. Chairman:

The American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009, Public Law 111-5 (the Recovery Act), was designed to stimulate economic growth by creating millions of jobs through investments in infrastructure improvements and expanding energy research in an effort to lead the way toward energy independence for our country. On March 20 and April 28, 2009, the Department submitted its initial plans to implement the Recovery Act, identifying specific military construction (MILCON), Energy Conservation Investment Program (ECIP), and facility sustainment, restoration, and modernization (FSRM) projects that improve facilities and energy efficiency.

At that time, the Department indicated that it would amend the plans if significant changes occurred during implementation. This letter notifies the Congress of the Department's FSRM program changes. This revision:

- Cancels three Army FSRM projects and adds 15 projects funded primarily with bid savings (enclosure 1); and
- Replaces one Tricare Management Agency (TMA) FSRM project with three TMA FSRM projects (enclosure 2).

This letter also includes a Title 10 USC 2811 notification (enclosure 3) and revised state summary (enclosure 4). The Department appreciates the continued support of the Congress for Defense facility and infrastructure programs. Similar letters have been sent to the chairmen and ranking members of the Senate Armed Services Committee and the Committees on Appropriations of the House and Senate.

Project Number (PN) 53 is canceled due to escalating costs approaching 90% of the facility's present replacement value. This level of investment is not considered a prudent use of Recovery Act funds. Escalating costs are attributable to mechanical and electrical upgrades and structural repairs on the 1st and 2nd floors that are integral to the completion of the 3rd floor modernization. The funds from the canceled project will be used to fund new PNs 156, 157, and 158 and to fund anticipated contract modifications on other awarded Recovery Act TMA projects.

## Congressional Notification under Title 10 U.S.C. 2811 Operation and Maintenance Funded Projects in Excess of \$7.5 Million

Pursuant to Section 2811 of Title 10, United States Code, the Department of Defense intends to proceed with the Facility Sustainment, Restoration and Modernization project shown below, which is funded by the Operation and Maintenance, Defense-Wide Recovery Act appropriation.

## Defense-Wide

Medical Center – Repair Heating, Ventilation and Air Conditioning System, Travis Air Force Base, CA – Estimated cost of this project is \$8.146 million.

<u>Description</u>: The project provides a new dedicated exhaust duct system for hazardous exhaust, general exhaust, return air, and supply air streams. The project will convert existing exhaust air systems serving the air handlers operating with 100% outside air to an efficient return mixed air configuration. The project will replace the building automation system which is needed to provide the required building pressurization. The entire heating, ventilation, and air conditioning system will be re-commissioned and rebalanced.

## Army-Wide

Repair HVAC and other Components, Advanced Individual Training Barracks 29703, 15th Signal Corp, Ft Gordon, GA- Estimated cost of this project is \$14.400 million.

<u>Description:</u> The project is to repair the existing training barracks to correct life, health and safety issues and bring the facility to current construction codes. It will repair the current 40 yr old utility systems to include rehabilitation of the HVAC system. Space upgrades to the Advanced Individual and Advanced Skills Training Barracks will provide 90 square feet per student and limit sharing of bathrooms to no more than 4 students per bathroom.
