Coauthors include Marc Connelly, Edna Ferber, Moss Hart, Ring Lardner, Isabel Leighton, Herman J. Mankiewicz, Robert Nathan, Irving Pichel, W.W. de Renne, Morrie Ryskind, Herbert Seligman, and Alexander Woollcott. The collection includes the comedies *June Moon, Dinner at Eight*, and *Stage Door* along with the musical comedies *The Cocoanuts, Helen of Troy, New York*, and *Let 'Em Eat Cake*.
