Scope and Content Note

The collection of Evelyn Wadsworth Symington (1903-1972) of John Hay material spans the years 1864-1905. The papers consist of letters, diaries, a speech, poetry and writings, newspaper clippings, and other documents by and about John Hay, Symington's grandfather. Individuals represented by letters, poetry, or subject matter include Henry Adams, Alfred Austin, Philippe Bunau-Varilla, Lloyd Carpenter Griscom, Abraham Lincoln, Robert Todd Lincoln, William McKinley, John G. Nicolay, and William T. Sherman.

BOX 1	Reading copy of Hay's memorial address on President William McKinley before Congress and his handwritten draft of the address
BOX 1	Concurrent resolution of House and Senate thanking Hay for his McKinley memorial address, accompanied by a letter of transmittal
BOX 2	Manuscript volume entitled "Lincoln and the Army of the Potomac", (470 pages), a portion of which is in the handwriting of Hay. Consists of drafts of segments of the text of <i>Abraham Lincoln, a History</i> , by Hay and John G. Nicolay
BOX 2	Manuscript (fair copy) of a poem entitled "Buddha and Brahma", (24 pages) by Henry Adams, with covering letter from Adams to Hay, 1895, Apr. 26
