Abstract: Social leader, author, and prominent Washingtonian. Family and general correspondence, diaries, journals, and commonplace books consisting mainly of family

correspondence between Smith and her sisters, Jane Bayard Kirkpatrick and Maria Bayard Boyd,

and her husband, journalist and banker, Samuel Harrison Smith (1772-1845).

The papers of Margaret Bayard Smith, social leader, author, and prominent Washingtonian, were given to the Library of Congress by Harold Dillingham, Baldwin Wood, Alice Smith, and Henrietta Smith in 1910. An addition was purchased in 1944.

The Margaret Bayard Smith Papers were processed for microfilming in 1983. The finding aid was revised in 2011.

Scope and Content Note

The papers of Margaret Bayard Smith (1778-1844) span the years 1789-1874, with the bulk of the material concentrated in the period 1796-1840. The collection includes family and general correspondence, diaries, journals, and commonplace books. The bulk of the papers consists of family correspondence between Smith and her sisters Jane Bayard Kirkpatrick and Maria Bayard Boyd, and her husband, journalist and banker Samuel Harrison Smith (1772-1845). Other correspondents include Mary Hering Middleton, Madame A. Emilie Pichon, and Eliza Susan Moton Quincy. Topics covered include Washington, D.C., social life, presidential elections, the British occupation of Washington in 1814, and visits to Monticello, Virginia.
