Hayden, to be General in the United States Air Force.

Ordered further, That following those votes the Senator from Florida (Mr. Nelson) be recognized to speak for 5 minutes and the Senate then proceed to a cloture vote with respect to the nomination of Dirk Kempthorne, of Idaho, to be Secretary of the Interior; provided further, if cloture is invoked the Senator from Louisiana (Ms. Landrieu) then be recognized for 10 minutes and the Senate then proceed to an immediate vote on the confirmation of the nomination of Dirk Kempthorne.
