UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENTS

Charles W. Pickering, Sr. (Cal. No. 400)

Ordered, That relative to the motion to invoke cloture on the nomination of Charles W. Pickering, Sr., of Mississippi, to be United States Circuit Judge for the Fifth Circuit, the live quorum, as required under Rule XXII, be waived. (October 28, 2003.)

Ordered, That at 9:00 a.m. on Thursday, October 30, 2003, the Senate proceed to executive session to consider the nomination of Charles W. Pickering, Sr., of Mississippi, to be United States Circuit Judge for the Fifth Circuit.

Ordered further, That there be 60 minutes equally divided between the Chairman of the Committee on the Judiciary and the Ranking Member, with the final 10 minutes divided with the first 5 minutes under the control of the Democratic Leader or his designee and the final 5 minutes under the control of the Majority Leader or his designee.

Ordered further, That following the debate the Senate proceed to a cloture vote on the nomination; and further, if cloture is not invoked, the Senate return to legislative session. (October 29, 2003)
