The Defense Contract Management Agency maintains FraudNET to facilitate reporting of allegations of fraud, waste, abuse, or mismanagement of federal funds.

In all cases, please provide as much detail as possible concerning the **who, when, where, what, how and how much**. You do not need to provide your name.



Note: Use the Tab key or your mouse to move between the fields.

Although it is not necessary, you may provide your name and address or a pseudonym if you wish.

The following are examples of information you may be able to provide:

- The programs involved and any specific restrictions, rules, or regulations that relate to them.
- What the individual(s) did. Include anything the individual may have done to avoid detection.
- Names, positions, organizations involved in the activity, as well as the names of individuals involved. Include the name, address, and telephone numbers, if possible.
- Date(s) of the misconduct or the wrongdoing.

When providing information concerning contractor and/or grantee fraud, it is helpful to provide the following:

1. Name and address of the prime and any subcontractors;
2. Nature of the wrongdoing (e.g., providing defective or nonconforming products, cost mischarging, defective pricing, conflict of interest, or bribes/gratuities);
3. Type of contract (e.g., fixed-fee or cost type);
4. Contract, or grant numbers;
5. Name of the Contract Management Office responsible for administering the contract or grant; and
6. Cost and terms of the contract.

If the misconduct has been reported to another federal office, provide as much information as possible on when it was reported and who received the report.
