## The Ocean and Coastal Economy: A Summary of Statistics

## Measures of the Ocean and Coastal Economy:

1. GDP (Gross Domestic Product): Value of goods and services that are produced.
2. Employment: \# people employed by business establishments, including part-time/seasonal; does not include self-employed workers.
3. Annual Wages: Wages paid to employees.
4. Business Establishments: Individual places of business; single firm may have multiple.

## The Ocean Economy ${ }^{1}$

The ocean economy is comprised of six economic sectors that depend on the oceans and Great Lakes. (This is a subset of the Coastal Economy, shown to the right.) This annual time-series data is produced for 448 coastal counties, 30 coastal states, and the nation using data from the Bureau of Labor Statistics and the Bureau of Economic Analysis. Data are currently available for the years 2005 to 2009.

## The Coastal Economy ${ }^{2}$

Coastal Watershed Counties Summary Statistics (2010):

A Coastal Watershed County is one in which at least $15 \%$ of the county's total land area is located within a coastal watershed or a USGS coastal cataloging unit.

## When to Use:

When discussing the size of the economy and population that impacts the coast and ocean.

Shore Adjacent Counties Summary Statistics (2010): Shore Adjacent Counties are those touched in whole or in part by a state's coastal zone for purposes of the Coastal Zone Management Act of 1972 as defined by that state and which is adjacent to an ocean, Great Lake, or included river or bay.

## When to Use:

When discussing the economy and population that benefits directly or indirectly from activity in the coastal zone.

## The Coastal Population ${ }^{3}$

The coastal population consists of those living in Coastal Watershed Counties, which are those counties for which at least $15 \%$ of the county's total land area is located within a coastal watershed or a USGS coastal cataloging unit.

## When to Use:

This geography is helpful in describing the population that directly impacts the coast by residing in coastal and estuarine drainage areas (i.e. daily decisions and habits may impact coastal health).

## What You Need to Know:

| $53 \%$ | Percent of the nation's total population that lived in coastal watershed counties in <br> 2010 (17\% of the total land area excluding Alaska). |
| :--- | :--- |
| 50.8 million | Increase in U.S. coastal watershed county population from 1970 to 2010 (or a 45\% <br> increase). |
| $6 \%$ | Percent of U.S. coastal watershed county population that resided in Los Angeles <br> County, CA in 2010 (the leading county in coastal population). |
| 15.6 million | Expected increase in U.S. coastal watershed county population by 2020 (or a 10\% <br> increase). |
