

Fort Peck (Assiniboine and Sioux) Reservation /Dry Prairie Rural Water System

Project Description

The Fort Peck (Assiniboine and Sioux) Reservation/Dry Prairie Rural Water System is providing drinking water to 27,434 people in eastern Montana. American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 funding is being used to complete construction of the water treatment plant, and accelerate: rights-of-way acquisition, engineering design, and construction of project pipeline segments.



Project Benefits

Completing this portion of the rural water project is allowing the continual project construction which will provide future drinking water to area residents currently relying on poor quality water supplies.

Project Status

Funding of \$39.8 million was provided to the Fort Peck Tribe on August 26, 2009. This funding is being used to install the following:

- Approximately 2 miles of the raw water pipeline from the intake structure to the Water Treatment Plant (WTP), is scheduled to be completed in the fall of 2010.
- Phase II of the WTP, is scheduled to be completed by May 2011.
- The WTP to Poplar pipeline; bids on this project were opened on June 15, 2010 and award of the project is scheduled for July 2010. The project is scheduled to be completed by September 2011.
