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SULFUR IN SEPTEMBER 2012

During September 2012, production of recovered elemental sulfur was 689,000 metric tons (t), which was 6% less than that of August 2012 and slightly more than that of September 2011. Shipments were 695,000 t, which was 5% less than those of August 2012. Producers' ending stocks for September 2012 were 142,000 t.

Imports of recovered sulfur for September 2012 were estimated to be 233,000 t; exports were 192,000 t. Imports of sulfuric acid for September 2012 were 232,000 t; exports were 17,000 t.

U.S. sulfur consumption, calculated as shipments minus exports plus imports, was 736,000 t in September 2012. This was about 11% less than that of August 2012 and about 6% less that of September 2011.

Significant adjustments have been made to the sulfur import data. The U.S. Census Bureau appears to underreport sulfur imports, especially material from Canada. The revised figures are based on Census information and data from personal communications with industry experts.
