SPRINGFIELD - Governor Pat Ouinn named Daniel M. Krumrei as the 38th Adjutant General of the Illinois National Guard and director of the Department of Military Affairs Dec. 21.

The former colonel served as command staff chaplain for the Illinois National Guard since 2005 and was instrumental in fulfilling Governor Quinn's longtime

commitment to serving servicemembers and their families.

"General Krumrei has served in the National Guard for more than 35 years and has made it his mission to ensure that our servicemembers get the support they need to be successful in the military and in their civilian lives," Quinn said. "His extensive experience at all levels of the Guard and with people of all faiths will be invaluable as we work to keep the Illinois National Guard the most effective force in the nation."

Krumrei (pronounced KRUM-ROY) joined the National Guard in 1977 and has served in a wide variety of roles including field artillery, nuclear, biological, chemical weapons specialist and chaplain. Since joining the Illinois Army National Guard in 1992 as a chaplain, he has made assisting servicemembers and their families a priority of the Illinois National Guard.

Magny wrestled in high school and after his senior year joined the Army, where he learned techniques through the Modern Army Combatives Program (MACP).
