Following introduction to the Committee, the President was escorted into the building and into the Hall of Honor and to the dias where he was greeted by Senator Hernan Videla, President of the Chilean Senate. Senator Videla introduced the President to Senor Raul Juliet, President of the Chilean Chamber of Deputies and to Senor Ernesto Goycoolen, Secretary of the Chamber, as well as to Senor Eduardo Yrarrazaval, the Acting Secretary of the Senate. The President was then seated and Senator Videla opened the Joint Session of the Chilean Congress and delivered a brief welcoming speech to the President (this was not followed by a translation but Colonel Watlers interpreted to the President as Senator Videla spoke).



Following the remarks of Senator Videla, the President delivered an ADDRESS TO THE NATIONAL CONGRESS OF CHILE (interpreted by Colonel Walters paragraph by paragraph) for approximately 40 minutes.

At the end of the President's address, Senor Juliet, President of the Chilean Chamber of Deputies, made a short speech of appreciation for the President's remarks. Senator Videla then came forward and presented to the President, on behalf of the National Congress of Chile, a Gold Medal commomorating his visit to the Congress.

At the end of the applause following the Presentation the President took his immediate leave of the Hall of Honor, being escorted out by the Committee which met him upon his arrival.


