A Position Statement of the National Emergency Medical Services Advisory Council

Adopted on September 8, 2011

Ten years have passed since the devastating terrorist attacks against the United States on September 11, 2001. The horrors of that day will never be forgotten and the heroism displayed will be etched in our memories forever. Emergency medical services (EMS) providers, firefighters, law enforcement, 9-1-1 professionals and other responders, went above and beyond the call of duty that day and in the weeks and months thereafter. These providers exceed public expectations on a daily basis and their actions of September 11th are not surprising to those who work in emergency services.

We pay homage to all emergency responders who lost their lives so others might live. A special praise goes out to the EMS systems in New York City, Arlington, VA, Shanksville, PA and to all of the jurisdictions and providers who responded to the events of September 11th.
