# CHAPTER 6 STANDARDS OF FILL 

## CURRENT

■For containers other than cans:
1.75 Liters 200 ml

1 Liter $\quad 100 \mathrm{ml}$
$750 \mathrm{ml} \quad 50 \mathrm{ml}$
375 ml

NOTE: 500 ml was an authorized standard of fill for bottling until June 30, 1989
■For cans:
355 ml
200 ml
100 ml
50 ml

## PRE-1980

## - STANDARDS OF FILL

■For distilled spirits other than liqueurs/cordials, bitters, recognized cocktails and distilled spirits specialties bottled before January 1, 1980:

1 gallon $\quad 4 / 5$ pint
1⁄2 gallon $\quad 1 / 2$ pint
1 quart $\quad 1 / 8$ pint
4/5 quart $\quad 1 / 10$ pint
1 pint $\quad 1 / 16$ pint (for brandy only)
■For liqueurs/cordials, bitters, recognized cocktails and distilled spirits specialties bottled before January 1, 1980:

There are no standards of fill
If not bottled in one of the sizes listed in this section ("PRE-1980"), net contents must be expressed in gallons, quarts, pints, fluid ounces

## - LABELING NOTE

For distilled spirits bottled before January 1, 1980, the net contents statement must appear on the FRONT of the container

## - DOCUMENTATION

Documentation of bottling or packing prior to January 1, 1980 must accompany the application for certificate of label approval (COLA):

For domestic distilled spirits, documentation is a bottling record

For imported distilled spirits, documentation is a bottling date certificate issued by an authorized certifying official in the country of origin or country of bottling

NOTE: The documentation requirement also applies to distilled spirits bottled before July 1, 1989 in 500 ml containers
