OCC Announces New Director for Press Relations

Robert M. Garsson, Jr., will be the new director for press relations at the Office of the Comptroller of the Currency (OCC), said Matthew Roberts, senior deputy comptroller for public affairs. Mr. Garsson will begin work at the OCC on October 6.
