NCI Community Cancer Centers Program

Key Points

- The National Cancer Institute Community Cancer Centers Program (NCCCP) is a network of community hospitals from around the United States working with NCI to improve patient access to high-quality cancer care and to expand cancer research taking place at the nation's community hospitals.
- The NCCCP sites support or conduct basic, clinical, and population-based research in risk assessment, prevention, detection, diagnosis, treatment, surveillance, and end-of-life care, and are working to apply the latest research findings to their cancer practices.
- NCI launched the NCCCP in 2007 as a pilot program with 16 sites. The NCCCP network currently includes 21 community hospitals in 16 states, selected through a competitive review process. Lessons learned from the program are being shared with community hospitals nationwide through the program website, presentations and publications.

New knowledge and advanced technology allow complex cancer treatment – once only available at large academic-based cancer centers – to be provided at community hospitals. Through a public-private partnership between NCI and 21 community hospitals, the NCCCP is examining how to best provide patients access to advanced cancer care at community hospitals, where the vast majority of people with cancer in the United States are diagnosed and treated.

The NCCCP sites are located in rural, suburban, and urban areas and serve a diverse population base. Through the network, NCCCP sites have access to NCI resources and expertise, work with the participating organizations to achieve program goals, and have developed research collaborations with the larger NCI-designated Cancer Centers. Network-level partnerships have been established with the American Society of Clinical Oncology, the American College of Surgeons' Commission on Cancer, the American Cancer Society and other national organizations. Many sites are participating in projects with other NCI programs such as The Cancer Genome Atlas and the NCI Community Networks Program. The network has been able to support research conducted by other research organizations and investigators.

The NCCCP sites are working to improve cancer outcomes in their communities, especially among medically underserved populations. The NCCCP network is working to:

- Accrue greater numbers of patients in the community to cancer clinical trials;
- Improve cancer care quality by increasing use of evidence-based guidelines and participating in national quality reporting initiatives;
- □ Increase the number of cancer screening events offered to underserved patients to detect cancer early;
- Enhance survivorship and palliative care programs for cancer patients;
- Expand the practice of a multidisciplinary team approach to cancer care;
- Offer more patients genetics counseling services;
- Increase collection of high-quality biospecimens for research purposes.
