## **GUIDELINES FOR STUDENTS**

- Students should be respectful of the exhibits and other visitors.
- Students are required to stay with their sponsors at all times, including in the Gift Shop.
- Food and drinks, including gum and candy, are NOT permitted in the buildings.
- Students are to speak in low voices in the buildings.
- No running in the buildings.
- Flash photography is not allowed in any of the buildings. Bring only cameras which do not have a flash or cameras which can have the flash turned off.
- With the exception of those unable to use stairs, we ask that students do not use the elevators or wheelchair lifts.
- Do not touch or write on paintings, exhibits, walls or glass cases.

## SUGGESTIONS FOR CHAPERONES

There are certain things that chaperones can do to make their groups visit to the Eisenhower Center more enjoyable

- As a chaperone, you help to set the tone for the visit. Your respect for the public facility and your responsiveness to the teacher's goals are all passed on to the students.
- Remember, you are coming to view the exhibits with your group. This is an opportunity to help and to interact with students, not a personal tour.
- Find out as much as possible from the teacher about the focus for this visit. Make sure to use and hold onto any materials or information that the teacher provides for you.
- Work with the group of students assigned to you. Even if your group is on a guided tour, you can assist the docent by keeping your group together and staying involved with them. This also works well if they are not having a guided tour.
- Encourage students to be considerate of other museum visitors. Please help us keep students from running through the buildings, bringing food into the buildings, from touching exhibits, and from playing in the fountains. Photographs are permitted, but no flash may be used!
