Authority may not be re-delegated below the office director level. All significant <i>Federal Register</i> notices (e.g., financial, precedent-setting, or NOS programmatic, policy-setting or regulatory notices) will continue to require signature at the NOS Assistant Administrator/Deputy level or above.
