Virginia Implementation Team

- Formed to gain the largest reach and have a concentrated outreach effort
- Members identified based on population served, level of influence, and potential reach
- Members of the Health Commissioner's Workgroup on Infant Mortality and other key Maternal Child Health partners
 - INOVA and Sentara Norfolk Health System
 - Healthy Start Programs and WIC
 - Virginia Sections of American Congress of Obstetrics and Gynecology (ACOG), American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP), Association of Women's Health Obstetric and Neonatal Nurses (AWHONN)
 - Department of Medical Assistance Services





Virginia Implementation Team Outreach Plan Development

- Multiple teleconferences with Healthy Mothers Healthy Babies and Voxiva participated
 - Gain support of the project
 - Work through logistical details
 - Brainstorm on outreach strategies
 - Commitment to activities
 - Development of the outreach plan
- Face to Face Meeting with all members and other stakeholders (October 2009)
- Beta Testing (November 2009)
- Statewide Press Release (February 2010)





Virginia Outreach Plan

Inova Health System – email information to all obstetrical providers working in the Inova Health System.

Sentera – promote and participate in the project through the hospital obstetrical staff and outreach to patients; participate in the beta testing.

WIC – Promote the project to participants in clinics and display promotional material.

Virginia Chapter, AAP – email information to all members.

Virginia Section, ACOG – email information to all of members (> 880).

Virginia Section, AWHONN – email information (>800); announced at the statewide meeting and conference to be held October 12-13, 2009.

Richmond City Healthy Start Initiative – distribute promotional materials to all clients; brief the Executive Committee regarding project; participate in the beta testing.

Virginia Healthy Start Initiative/Loving Steps – distribute promotional materials to all clients in the three sites of Norfolk, Petersburg, and Westmoreland County; will provide briefing to staff at next quarterly meeting in October; participate in the beta testing.

Department of Medical Assistance Services/Medicaid and CHIP – combined outreach efforts for Medicaid and FAMIS pregnant women in both fee for service and Managed Care.





Virginia Medicaid/CHIP Involvement

Two levels of involvement:

- 1. Fee for Service
 - Website linkages to Text4baby
 - Materials-letter sent to all pregnant women which included information on how to enroll in Text4baby
- 2. Managed Care Organizations (MCOs)
 - Various types of outreach within each MCOs





Virginia Medicaid/CHIP Outreach

Website Linkages

- Add information to website
- Put under What's New section of DMAS site
- Include on Staying Healthy FAMIS site

Materials

- Include in letters sent to all pregnant women including Medicaid and FAMIS MOMS (CHIP for pregnant woman)
- Make materials available to both eligibility entry points (local Department of Social Services and Central Processing Unit)

Training

- Training conducted at both eligibility entry points
- BabyCare Provider training





Virginia Medicaid Managed Care Outreach

- Included information in prenatal mailings
- Included information when making home visits to pregnant members
- Added information to website
- Included a Text4baby article in member newsletters
- Trained customer service reps to talk to pregnant women about how to enroll
