As the Commandant of NATO School, Oberammergau, Germany, Colonel Baines commands a faculty and staff representing 26 different NATO and Partnership for Peace nations, and is responsible for all aspects of NATO School's operation.

Colonel Mark D. Baines is a native of New Hampshire and was born in August of 1961. After graduation from Manchester Central High School, he attended Norwich University where he received a Bachelors of Arts degree in Criminal Justice. Additional degrees include a Masters of Science Degree in Administration from Central Michigan University and a Masters in National Security and Strategic studies from the U.S. Army War College.
