TRACKING AN APPLICATION SUBMISSION

SUBMISSION STATUS CODES

The following are definitions of the eleven application status codes used to describe the progression of an application after submission through the Grants.gov system.

1. RECEIVING

The application is has not yet been received by Grants.gov, but is processing normally, and is waiting in the queue to be received by Grants.gov.

2. RECEIVED

Indicates that Grants.gov has received the application, but is awaiting validation or rejected with errors.

3. FIFRECEIVING

The application has been received by Grants.gov and is in the beginning stages of being either validated or rejected with valid errors.

4. PROCESSING

The application has been received by Grants.gov and has begun checking the application for errors.

5. VALIDATED

Indicates that Grants.gov received and validated the application and it is available for the agency to download.

6. REJECTED WITH ERRORS

Indicates that Grants.gov was unable to process your application because of an error(s) and cannot accept the application until you correct the error(s) and successfully resubmit the application. You will receive email notification with information on how to address the error(s).

7. ACCEPTED

The application is ready for download by the agency.

8. RECEIVED BY AGENCY

Indicates that the agency has downloaded the application package.

9. PURGED

The application has been on the system for 180 days or more and has been purged from the system.

10. AGENCY TRACKING NUMBER ASSIGNED

Indicates that the agency has assigned an internal tracking number to your application. This is the last status that Grants.gov tracks. Updates beyond this must be checked with the agency directly.

Note: All agencies do not assign tracking numbers. If you do not see an agency tracking number, this does not infer that the agency did not receive or process your application. The assignment of tracking numbers is based on the policy of a particular agency.

11. PACKAGING PROCESS

The application is still being processed and will be validated within the next 48 hours by Grants.gov.
