Travel days are January 27, 2013 and January 31, 2013.

Course Length:

This course is 4 days in length.

Course Description:

This course provides State, local, and tribal staffs with an overview of FEMA's Public Assistance (PA) Program, process, and policies. Course topics include introduction to program laws, regulations, policies, the PA process, grants management, eligibility,hazard mitigation in the PA program, compliance with other Federal laws and regulations, and project formulation.

Course Goal:

This course will cover the applicable laws, regulations, and policies that affect the PA Program as well as the requirements for Federal, state, and local disaster declarations. Instruction includes the joint preliminary damage assessment process, eligibility criteria, formulating projects, documentation requirements, and hands-on training in the Emergency Management Mission Integrated Environment (EMMIE) system.

Prerequisites:

Completion of Independent Study (IS) course IS 634 Introduction to FEMA's Public Assistance Program (or the former version, IS 630 Introduction to the Public Assistance Process). To enroll, use URL: http://training.fema.gov/EMIWeb/IS/IS634.asp
