## COL EDWARD "Ted" E. HILDRETH Commander 100<sup>th</sup> Missile Defense Brigade (GMD)

COL Edward "Ted" E. Hildreth III assumes command as the fourth brigade commander of the 100<sup>th</sup> Missile Defense Brigade, Ground-based Midcourse Defense (GMD), Colorado Army National Guard. COL Hildreth earned his bachelor's degree in civil engineering and was commissioned as an Air Defense Artillery officer from the Army ROTC program at Vanderbilt University in 1988. After graduating from the ADA Officer Basic Course in 1989, he served as Vulcan/Stinger platoon leader and executive officer in Battery A, 2-44<sup>th</sup> ADA Battalion, 101<sup>st</sup> Airborne Division (Air Assault). There, he participated in Operations Desert Shield and Desert Storm from August 1990 through April 1991.

In 2000, COL Hildreth transitioned to the ARNG Title-10 program where he served again in an acquisition assignment with the Distributed Training Technology Project. In 2001, COL Hildreth was selected for a graduate studies fellowship, completing his master's degree in engineering management at the New Jersey Institute of Technology in 2002. After graduate school, he was assigned as chief live, Virtual and Constructive Training Team, ARNG Directorate, Arlington, Va., where he served until assuming responsibility as chief, Collective Training Branch in 2004.
