# INSTRUCTIONS

Send a **letter on your jurisdiction's official letterhead** requesting a Special Census cost estimate. Indicate if you are requesting a cost estimate for a full or partial Special Census, along with your estimated population and housing unit counts. The letter should be signed by your Highest Elected Official or designee.


Complete the **Transmittal Form** below and **Special Census Cost Estimate Worksheet** (pages 3-6) and include with your letter.

Include a \$200 check for the nonrefundable cost estimate processing fee, made payable to

"Commerce-Census." Attach your check to this transmittal form.
