Health Communication Fellowship in Basic Biobehavioral and Psychological Sciences, 2012

Introduction

The Behavioral Research Program (BRP) is within the National Cancer Institute's Division of Cancer Control and Population Sciences. BRP initiates, supports, and evaluates a comprehensive program of research ranging from basic behavioral research to the development, testing, and dissemination of interventions in areas such as tobacco use, screening, dietary behavior, and sun protection. BRP increases the breadth, depth, and quality of behavioral research in cancer prevention and control through its six <u>Branches</u>. BRP is pleased to invite applications from qualified candidates for a Cancer Research Training Award (CRTA) Fellowship position in the <u>Basic Biobehavioral and Psychological Sciences Branch (BBPSB</u>). BBPSB advances research in biobehavioral mechanisms and psychological processes to reduce cancer risk and improve outcomes.

This full-time position is based in Rockville, Maryland and provides outstanding opportunities for training and professional development in behavioral research and basic biobehavioral and psychological sciences. CRTA Fellows interact daily with researchers in public health, behavioral medicine, and cancer prevention, as well as with various extramural scientists at the National Cancer Institute and across the National Institutes of Health.

Position Description

The CRTA Fellow will function as a member of the staff and work directly with scientists on projects related to the BBPSB <u>research priorities</u>. The CRTA Fellow's key functionality will be to serve as the Branch Communication Liaison to prepare informational requests, develop written material, and oversee dissemination strategies. Day-to-day activities include, but are not limited to:

- Maintain the BBPSB website and factsheets;
- Conduct interviews and contribute to media articles;
- Events planning and project management;
- Review and research primary scientific sources.

Additionally, the Fellow may have the opportunity to travel to National Conferences, such as annual meetings of the American Psychological Association or Society for Behavioral Medicine.

Qualifications

- Master degree in science writing, health communication, public health, or a related discipline, with a specific interest in behavioral science is required. Candidates with a Bachelor degree and 5+ years of relevant and applied experience may also be considered.
- Very strong communication and writing skills; experience developing content for websites preferred.
- Experience with multimedia (e.g., podcasts, videos, social media) preferred.
- Excellent academic standing and professional references.
- Excellent organizational and project management skills.
- Excellent interpersonal skills and ability to work independently and in teams.
