Course: B449 Incident Command System (ICS) Curricula Train-The-Trainer

Dates: March 4-7, 2013

Travel Dates:

Travel days are March 3 and March 8, 2012.

Course Length:

This course is 4 days in length.

Course Description:

This course prepares participants to deliver EMI's ICS curricula. While ICS courses are addressed, the major emphasis is on ICS 300 and 400.

Course Goal:

The course is designed to prepare instructors to deliver Incident Command System related training courses.

Prerequisite:

ICS 100, ICS 200, ICS 300, ICS 400, IS 700 and IS 800. NOTE: Students must have taken the Emergency Management Institute, US Department of Agriculture, National Fire Academy or National Wildfire Coordinating Group ICS courses. Other ICS courses will be reviewed for consistency with the ICS objectives prescribed by the NIMS Integration Center.

Participants must have worked as IC, command or general staff positions on incidents, planned events or exercises that went longer than one operational period or involved a written action plan and involved multiagency coordination.

Continuing Education Units (CEU's):

The Emergency Management Institute (EMI) awards 3.1 CEUs for completion of this course.

Target Audience:

Participants who have a working knowledge of ICS through experience and training, and have experience delivering adult training. Participants must have worked as IC, command or general staff positions on incidents, planned events or exercises that were active for multiple operational periods or involved a written action plan and involved multiagency coordination.

Location:

To Apply:

Complete a FEMA Form 119-25-1, General Admissions Application with student signature and signature of supervisor or sponsoring agency official. Submit the application through the State Emergency Management Training office which will mail, scan, or fax it to:
