## Course: E910 - Integrated Emergency Management Course (IEMC), Earthquake: Preparedness and Response

## Course Dates:

July 22-25, 2013

## Travel Dates:

Travel days are Sunday, July 21 and Friday, July 26, 2013.

## Course Length:

This course is 4 days in length; 8:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m. each day.

## Course Description:

The E910 IEMC, Earthquake: Preparedness and Response, addresses preparedness and response in emergency situations based on an earthquake. The participants in the "generic" audience represent various communities from throughout the country. The IEMC places public officials and other key community leaders in a disaster simulation. The course methodologies of classroom instruction, planning sessions, and exercises, allow for structured decision making in a learning, yet realistic, environment. A key outcome of this course is that additional planning needs are identified, providing the opportunity to enhance overall preparedness. The exercise scenario for the Earthquake: Preparedness and Response focuses on response to an earthquake. Also, additional planning needs to prepare for an earthquake response are identified.

## Prerequisite:

The following courses are recommended:

- IS $100 . \mathrm{b}$ - Introduction to the Incident Command System (ICS), ICS-100
- IS 200.b - ICS for Single Resources and Initial Action Incidents, ICS-200
- IS 700.a - National Incident Management System (NIMS), An Introduction Course

The target audience for this course includes Emergency Operations Center (EOC) management personnel.
