1. Pentacel and Daptacel Vaccine Shortage

Sanofi Pasteur's Pentacel and Daptacel vaccines are expected to be in short supply through the summer of 2012. Providers should continue to follow the recommended immunizations schedule. There is sufficient supply of DTaP, IPV and Hib vaccines to complete the series started with Pentacel.

2. VIS updated to include a 2-D barcode

The MMR vaccine information sheet is one of the first to feature a 2D barcode (located on the back near the edition date). The barcode allows providers with a 2D barcode reader and the appropriate software to scan the VIS name and edition date into an electronic medical record or Immunization Information System. Using the barcode is an alternative to manually entering the information. Starting 24 April 2012, new and updated VISs will now contain a 2D barcode.

3. Vaccine Education Booklet

The American Academy of Microbiology recently published an excellent booklet titled, Adult Immunizations: A Grown-Up Thing To Do. 4. Initial Impact of Adenovirus Vaccine Program

In October 2011 DoD basic training sites resumed adenovirus vaccinations which had originally ceased in 1999. Preliminary data suggests that the vaccine is highly effective for febrile respiratory illness (FRI) caused by adenovirus type 4, demonstrating a 75% decrease in FRI cases. 5. Imported Human Rabies in US Army Soldier - 2011

August of 2011 a US Army soldier, who described a dog bite while in Afghanistan, reported to an emergency department in New York for suspected rabies. The soldier had not received the effective rabies post-exposure prophylaxis after the bite and subsequently died of rabies on August 31. All personnel reporting a dog bite while deployed must be medically evaluated for potential rabies exposure and treatment.
