1. What Are Your Clinic's New Year's Resolutions?

It's time to get your staff and clinic ready for 2012. Take some time to begin to look at how you can improve your immunization programs.

Designate a Staff Educator for your program. Assign a staff member to be the immunization training point of contact (POC) for your staff. The POC will be responsible for planning a tentative training calendar for the year to help the program meet the eight hour immunization specific training per year. Training can include on-line programs, manufacturer visits, hands on training, conference attendance, etc. The POC should help manage the staff training folders and track the training requirements for mandatory and section specific training. Talk to your regional analyst about how to build your program and options for additional training opportunities.

2. FDA Okays Prevnar 13 for Adults

Prevnar 13 was first approved by the US Food and Drug Administration (FDA) for use in infants and young children ages 6 weeks to 5 years. Due to the rapidly expanding population of older adults, among which pneumococcal infections remain an important cause of morbidity and mortality, Prevnar 13 has now been approved for use in adults 50 years of age and older. The FDA approved the age expansion on 30 Dec 2011. Prevnar 13 now joins Pneumovax 23 as a vaccine for the prevention of pneumonia in adults. ACIP recommends routine pneumococcal vaccination of all adults 65 years and older.

FDA Updated Communication on the Use of Jet Injectors with Inactivated Influenza Vaccine

9 Jan 2012

On 26 Oct 2011 the FDA released information on the use of jet injectors with vaccines. MMR is the only vaccine licensed for administration by a jet injector. Jet injectors should not be used with any other vaccine to include influenza. All immunizations should be administered in accordance with the package inserts.
