All requests will be accompanied by specific instructions on what medical information is required. Make sure you follow all of the instructions exactly,

You may fax or mail in documents, but please be aware that faxing or mailing documents may delay receipt for up to four weeks. Always remember to keep a photocopy of everything. Legal Clearance

If there are any legal issues identified by the Legal Office, you might be asked to provide additional information.

Placement

Only contact the Placement Office after you have been legally cleared. If you do not hear from your placement officer and your departure month is less than four months away, contact your recruiter for your placement officer's phone number.
