This fall and coming year promise substantial changes to coding and billing for behavioral healthcare providers. Effective January 1, 2013, there will be significant changes to Current Procedural Terminology (CPT) codes for psychiatry and psychotherapy services. Changes to CPT code sets are made by the American Medical Association on an annual basis, but decisions made this year will have a much higher-than-usual impact on behavioral healthcare. Are you ready for the impact this could have on your billing, contracts, work flow, and compliance? This webinar will review what is included in these changes, the potential impact on your organization, what questions to ask your local insurers, and other ways to prepare for what is ahead.
