



The Community & Rural Healthcare Program serves 40% of LAJVAHS Veterans each year with an increased number of available sites and services including Primary Care, Coumadin monitoring, women's healthcare, and a variety of telehealth capabilities

MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES

LAJVAHS staff strive to maintain a strong infrastructure that ensures adherence to the VHA Uniform Mental Health Services initiative and improves access to services in a variety of special program areas.


