General Description of Your Program	The Nebraska SEARCH program will recruit and retain rural health care providers by providing community-based student/resident experiences in underserved areas through collaboration with community organizations including Nebraska AHECs, creating interdisciplinary collaborations and partnerships outside of the classroom setting, and dispelling negative attitudes and beliefs regarding the provision of primary care in rural areas. In 2008, 43 of 93 Nebraska counties (almost 50%) are designated as Primary Care HPSA's, an increase from 35 counties in 2003. Sixty seven of Nebraska's counties do not have a general internal medicine physician there and another nine counties only have one. Eighteen counties have no dentist listed as having a primary practice location in their county and another 11 counties only have one general dentist. Twenty one counties have no metal health professionals; 87 of 93 counties are designated as mental health HPSAs.
Goals and Objectives	 Develop and expand linkages between community oriented sites and academic institutions. Provide opportunities for students and residents to train interdisciplinary teams. Nurture the development of culturally competent/community responsive primary care providers Expand statewide partnerships to meet the diverse primary care needs of the underserved. These goal and objectives will be met through a variety of activities which are listed below: Improved relations with Community Health Centers, inclusion of the newest CHC and development of a plan to assist them in increasing student rotations. Compile a list of community sites that provide interdisciplinary training and expand student opportunities to these sites.

	 Develop and utilize a tool to expand students' knowledge of the challenges faced by a rural and frontier culture (dealing with our high Caucasian population and the differences between a rural and urban mindset and lifestyle), provide cultural competence materials to facilities to expand cultural knowledge of different groups in NE.
