Where appropriate, students will also have opportunities to work at critical access hospitals and local health departments. **Goals and Objectives** Wisconsin SEARCH program priorities include: Providing assistance to primary care training programs seeking to develop opportunities for students to fulfill core curriculum requirements through rotations at underserved community sites. Several health professions programs are eager to partner with these sites, but have been unable to arrange student placement due to the burden of travel and housing cost for the students. Attracting students in all the targeted primary practice professions to elective rotations at underserved area sites, where excellent training opportunities exist, by providing travel and housing assistance. Developing the capacity of Wisconsin's federally qualified health centers to become "teaching community health centers," primary sites of education and residency training that are part of the health professionals' educational mainstream. Activities undertaken by Students/Residents in Program Clinical rotations for academic credit, either required or elective. Wisconsin Express, a one-week cultural immersion program available in May each year. The AHEC Community Health Internship Program (CHIP), an 8-week paid internship in the summer at local health departments, community health centers and other sites.
