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U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs

- Intermediate Care Technician (ICT) Program
 - 1 year pilot program
 - Creates a new emergency department role for past or soon to separate Medics, Med Techs, and Corpsmen
 - GS 6&7, full-time position
 - 15 Veterans Affairs Medical Centers funded in 2012
 - 40 applied

Physician Assistant Training in Primary Care Program

- 27 continuing current grantees
 - 18 awarded in 2011
- 2012 competition
 - Review points for veteran activities
 - 21 applications reviewed





Physician Assistant Training in Primary Care Program

- 13 new awards
 - \$2.5 million in first budget year
 - 2 newly established PA education programs
 - 11 report veteran activities (85%)
 - 11 states
 - 6 rural projects





Expansion of Physician Assistant Training Program

- 28 current grants
 - Awarded 2010
- Purpose to increase the number of physician assistants students trained and entering the workforce from 2010 to 2015
- Project more than 700 additional students will be trained by 2015
