Objective

 - What are key issues that will impact testing between trading partners?
 - How should testing be scheduled?
 - Should there be collaboration between entities –i.e. a large group of providers?
 - > If so, what kinds of entities should collaborate, and how?
 - > What are the challenges for testing collaboration?



Background

- Lessons learned from 4010A1 migration experience:
 - Identify authoritative interpretation of the changes
 - > Highlight specific conditional changes in the standard
 - Consider common-use case scenarios
 - > Address business-specific tests
- Compliance dates are fast approaching:
 - Level I Compliance: January 1, 2011
 - Level II Compliance: January 1, 2012



What issues will impact testing between partners?

- Achieving Level I Compliance:
 - Some waiting for clearinghouses & vendors
 - > Others are not as far along as they should be
 - WEDI has learned some clearinghouses & vendors are targeting 5010-readiness on December 31, 2010
- Inconsistent Level I testing will introduce problems during Level II
- Many are not considering partner migration project planning
- Challenges in tracking partner Level I compliance
- Recommendation:
 - > Set earlier date for clearinghouses & vendors to be 5010-ready
 - Recommend certification solutions to automate consistent testing



How should testing be scheduled?

- Take Level II planning seriously, especially for multiple partners
- Schedule early: Mid-2010
- Develop pilot partner migrations
 - Apply lessons learned for full migration
- Aggressively schedule Level II migration
 - Load heavily in first half of 2011
- Monitor partner progress to Level I Compliance
 - Proactively adjust schedule, as necessary
- Exchange testing criteria early
 - > Partners anticipate Level II testing during Level I compliance phase

Recommendation:

Heavily stress: An organization is not Level II compliant until all its partners are migrated by the end of 2011



Should there be collaboration between entities?

Yes.

- Collaboration by provider organizations will raise awareness.
- Payer organizations (e.g. AHIP, BCBSA)
 - Stress importance of 5010/ICD-10 time tables
- Traditional collaboration examples:
 - Some regional communities
 - > Hub (payer) & Spoke (provider) model

Recommendation:

- Enlist aid of provider organizations (e.g. AMA, MGMA) and payer organizations (e.g. BCBSA, AHIP)
- Consider collaboration through certification organizations and payer/provider organizations (e.g. WEDI)



What kind of entities should collaborate, and how?

- Vendors & Clearinghouses
 - Collaborate with their customers to enable compliance
- Regional Trading Partners
 - Critical for payers to take the lead with trading partner communities
- Provider Organizations / National Organizations
 - Critical to be a key vehicle to aid organizations (i.e., WEDI) achieve 5010 mandates

Recommendation:

- Inspire leadership by payers
- Engage associations help to raise awareness and help their membership succeed



What are the challenges for testing collaboration?

- Regional differences
 - Inconsistent levels of applied validation edits
 - > Vendor / Clearinghouse readiness
 - Companion guide edits
 - Will we have them?
 - When we they be ready?
- Lack of progress towards Level I compliance
 - Places short time-frame pressures on many healthcare organizations



Window to Achieve Compliance Is Closing

Considering:

- Current industry slow progress towards Level I
- Inconsistent testing across industry
- Recommendation:
 - Aid industry with consistent, automated certification approach, backed by industry experts
 - Places higher probability to achieve Level I on time
 - Achieves more consistent 5010 implementation







• Where are you in the migration process?








DISA Membership Survey Results


Do you plan to use a certification service?

Summary: Recommendations

- Set earlier 5010 compliance date for clearinghouses & vendors
- Support consistent, automated certification, backed by industry experts
- Recommend solutions to automate consistent testing
- Emphasize: An organization is not Level II compliant until *all* its partners are migrated by January 1, 2012
- Enlist aid of provider organizations (e.g. AMA, MGMA) & payer organizations (e.g. BCBSA, AHIP)
