

## OSC TRANSMITS VA REPORT CONFIRMING HOSPITAL FAILED TO INSPECT MEDICAL EQUIPMENT BEFORE USE ON PATIENTS

WASHINGTON, DC / April 20, 2010 – Today, the U.S. Office of Special Counsel (OSC) transmitted to the President and Congress the Department of Veterans Affairs' (VA) response to a whistleblower's allegations that employees at the VA Gulf Coast Veterans Health Care System, Biloxi VA Medical Center (Medical Center), Biloxi, Mississippi, failed to inspect and maintain medical equipment used on patients and attempted to conceal the lack of inspections.

The VA report substantiated allegations that the medical equipment inventory was inaccurate and not all medical equipment was inspected as required, prior to use on patients. Three employees were found to have intentionally mislabeled medical equipment to hide the fact that it had not been inspected.

To correct the deficiencies, the VA is conducting a full inventory of its medical equipment at the Medical Center with a target completion date of June 30, 2010. A Biomedical Engineer has been temporarily detailed to the Medical Center to help address the deficiencies, and the agency is hiring a full-time onsite Biomedical Engineer. Life support equipment has already been identified and inspected. The three employees found to have acted intentionally to cover-up the failures have been disciplined.

OSC determined that the agency's reports contain all the information required by statute and the findings appear reasonable. A copy of the transmittal to the President has been placed in OSC's public file and is now available online at <a href="https://www.osc.gov">www.osc.gov</a>.

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
