### **NSABB Charge**

- Recommend to the USG strategies for enhancing personnel reliability (PR) among individuals with access to biological select agents and toxins
- Overarching question: What is the optimal framework for ensuring PR in a manner that balances the needs for both biosecurity and rapid progress in the life sciences?
- To address these aims, the NSABB will consider:
  - Extant frameworks for PR
  - Features of an optimal PR program
  - Risks and benefits associated with PR programs
  - Metrics for evaluating PR programs

### Working Group Approach

- Discussion of PR with selected participants at November 2008 International Roundtable on DUR
  - Extant PR programs similar to those in US, mostly for federally funded defense research
  - Foreign personnel key component to research, major challenge for PR
  - Lessons to be learned from private sector
  - Culture of distrust vs. culture of openness
  - Misuse of expertise is a reality
  - PR programs can mitigate but not eliminate the risk of insider threats, can help with public trust
