Are you Victim of Sexual Harassment or Assault?



Soldier's Reporting Options Unrestricted Reporting

An Active Duty Sexual Assault Victim can elect an unrestricted report and can tell anyone about the assault. Services provided will include medical treatment and counseling. In addition, an investigation will be launched by the Chain of Command, Criminal Investigation Division and/or local police.

Restricted Reporting (Confidential Reporting) If an Active Duty Sexual Assault Victim desires a restricted report, the incident must be reported to only one of the following four entities: Sexual Assault Response Coordinator (SARC), Installation/Unit Victim Advocate, Chaplain, or a Health Care Provider.

Non-Active Duty Victim Reporting Options

Unless the assault is committed by the victim's spouse, the report will be unrestricted. Victim Advocates can assist through this difficult time. They can provide information and support during medical treatment, support during interviews with law enforcement, guidance through the court process, and referrals to counseling and support as needed.
